Team Jesus

This year the Summer Olympics will be held in Paris, France and nations around the world will be showcasing their finest athletes. In late June the U.S. Olympic Team Trials for Track & Field was held at Hayward Field in Eugene, Oregon. The United States has a strong tradition of producing talented athletes for the Olympics; and the televised events showed that especially among female sprinters, this year will be no exception.

The three fastest women sprinters who will be representing Team USA in the 100-meter event in Paris have an interesting story. Sha'Carri Richardson won the 100-meter final at the Olympic trials with a time of 10.71 seconds. Close behind her was Melissa Jefferson, with a time of 10.80 seconds, and Twanisha Terry, with a time of 10.89 seconds. What is interesting is that the three have been training together under coach Mitchell, and their bond has helped them push each other to new heights. They have become a formidable force in the track and field world, and their qualification for the Olympics is a testament to their hard work and dedication.

In a post-race interview, Sha'Carri Richardson, the fastest woman sprinter in the world, credited her success to her faith and her team. "I just want to give glory to God," she said. "I couldn't have done it without my teammates and my coach. We're all in this together, and I'm just grateful to be here." Jefferson and Terry echoed Richardson's sentiments, praising their team and their faith for their success.

The success of these three runners reminds me of the Apostle Paul, who frequently would speak of life as a race. In his First Letter to the Corinthians (9:24-27), the apostle Paul encourages believers to run in a way that leads to obtaining the prize, which is eternal life with God.

- Everyone runs, but only one receives the prize: All believers are called to run, but only those who persevere and remain faithful will receive the ultimate prize of eternal life.
- Self-control and discipline are essential: It's important to focus on eternal rewards rather than temporary earthly rewards.
- Run the race that is set before you: Run and endure all things, for this is for your benefit. God is with you and strengthens you.

That's what our fellowship is in Christ is all about: We regularly meet on Sunday mornings for that very reason, we hear the Word of God together. Strengthened by God's Holy Spirit. We encourage and support one another, as runners in this race.
